

How to Write

PEEL PARAGRAPHS

POINT

P

Begin with a clear topic sentence that introduces your main idea.



Example: Reading regularly can help students improve their writing skills over time.

EVIDENCE

E

Support your point with a general example, fact, or observation.



Example: Some studies have shown that frequent reading is linked to a broader vocabulary and better grammar.

EXPLANATION

E

Explain how or why your evidence supports your point.



Example: This suggests that reading exposes students to language use they can apply in their own writing.

LINK

L

Connect back to the main idea or lead into the next point.



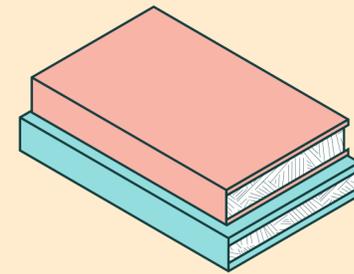
Example: therefore, regular reading can play an important role in developing effective communication skills.



TIPS FOR WRITING WITH PEEL

Stick to one clear idea per paragraph, use linking words, and make sure each sentence connects logically to the next.

WORD CLASSES



Words are divided into classes or groups depending on their function. Some of the main groups of words include the following:

Nouns

Words that name people, places, things or ideas.

E.g. dog, child, pencil, war, Thursday

Adjectives

Words that describe the qualities of a noun.

E.g. kind, clever, expensive, big

Verbs

Words that describe actions or states of being.

E.g. walk, jump, study, be, seem

Adverbs

Words that modify verbs, adjectives or other adverbs.

E.g. quickly, badly, generally, completely

Pronouns

Words that take the place of nouns.

E.g. me, you, his, it, this, that, mine, yours, who

Prepositions

Words usually in front of a noun or pronoun that express a relation to another word.

E.g. after, down, near, of, plus, round, to

Interjections

Words that occur as an utterance on their own to express a feeling or reaction.

E.g. ah, hey, oh, ouch, um, well

Conjunctions

Words that join words, phrases, clauses or sentences

E.g. but, and, yet, or, because, although, since, unless, while

Determiners

Words that come before a noun to introduce it.

E.g. a, an, the, my, his, some, this, both

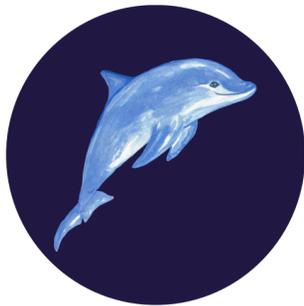
